

#### **Peter Kucksdof**

Peter Kucksdorf started his baseball career in grade school & little league in the summers, coached by the likes of Swampy Steinke & Floyd Kristof. The little league teams were great, winning multiple championships. Peter comments "I was very lucky to have grown-up in a community like Leopolis. I remember a game where I struggled at the plate and the next day Doc Kristof gave me a bat he had cut out of a 1"X12" board telling me this would improve my chances of making contact with the ball. "

The next stage in Peters baseball career was Junior league where this activity bridged the gap between little league and high school baseball. At Marion High School in the 70's, the coach was John Bartelt & conference titles were expected every year. Coach was a legend and Peter felt fortunate to play for him, playing third base throughout high school. Peter feels blessed to have played for Coach Bartelt, as he taught him many lessons that have served him well throughout his life.

Next came BABA and coaches Duane "Buckshot" Ashenbrenner followed by Bert Thiel. Peter played third base, some second base and even pitched a few games but most of his career was at first base. Peter felt the game played against Waupaca for the right to go to the Grand Championship was one of the best games he ever played in. Peter has many fond memories from those years. Peter batted just under .200 over a 15 year period with the Bulldogs.

The last stage began with running the Leopolis Little League for eleven years with his wife Judy, and they left it in great shape. Running the program meant everything from doing concessions to scheduling games, field manager, scheduling umps and of course coaching the games. Wife Judy made sure the details were covered so Peter would concentrate on coaching, and both did enjoy the boys & girls that played in the program.

Born Oct. 18, 1955 in Clintonville, to parents E.G." Pete" & Joan Kucksdorf, making up a family of Five, sisters Kay, Judy, Mary Paul & and a brother Jack. Today Peter is married to his beautiful wife Judy and they have two wonderful sons, Stephen, married to Julie and they live in Wilton IA, & Ryan, married to Alyssa, live in Anoka MN. Today, Peter works for Walker Forge in Clintonville, helps out at the Leopolis Triathlon, and is a member of this Leopolis Baseball Hall of Fame Committee.

Peter notes: "I have been blessed by God to have had Baseball & this community in my life. All of the coaches have had a positive influence on my life. One of the things I like most about the game is that you need to be thinking about the next play & beyond before the ball is pitched. You must be prepared to make the correct decision depending on the result of the outcome between the pitcher & batter. But no matter the outcome you carry on."

Tyler played Baseball all 4 years and a year of Basketball for Shawano High School, lettering in Baseball. He helped Shawano High Qualify for the State High School Baseball tourney in 1994. He Also:

- Was Named State Legion MVP 1994


Tyler attended the University Of Wisconsin - Stevens Point and married his high school sweetheart, Miss Heather Boldt in August of 1997

The 1995 Season sticks out to this generation...Lots of great games...Culminating in the Granny in Menominee. Memorable games include a First Win at 14 yrs old vs Gresham. A Complete Game! (Al Quinney let his bat go in 4th at bat after 4th Strikeout of the day), and a Makeup game played in Marion vs Tilleda where Tyler hit his one and only BABA homerun over centerfield. Going to the bar in Little Falls after a victory over the loggers and playing continuously on the Jukebox "throw another log on the fire"

Today Tyler works for City of Shawano as a Landfill Operator (21+ years) and in all that free time, he is President of Shawano School Board, President of Shawano Boys Hoops Basketball Program, Helps coach son Anderson's 9U baseball team, is a constant supporter of all the activities that 5 kids get into...Track, Cross Country, Basketball, Wrestling, Dance, Gymnastics, etc...Never a dull moment. Our family is very active and always on the go.

Billy's baseball career took a while to get going. After a short stint playing little league with friends and brothers in Marion for John Bartlet's Little League team, Billy had Farm work to do and that was always first priority. When Billy got to High School, Coach Bartelt tried to get him to come out for baseball, but knew farming had to come first.

Then one day, Orlie Pederson contacted Billy when he was like 17 years old, to come play ball for the Leopolis Bulldogs, joining a group of talented players, including Matt and Adam Lorge, Joe Prochaska, John Twaroski, fellow 2017 HOF Inductee Tyler Schmidt, Todd Peterson, Tom Kristof and others. When others moved on, Billy stuck it out in Leopolis, where everyone remembers Billy as being unselfish and willing to do anything or play anywhere he was needed.

A number of people can remember Billy at every position, except catching and he concurs. "I don't ever remember getting down behind the plate"

Again, a number of fans remember the Chants from the grandstand, or maybe Fred Zimmerman by the beer stand... "Bring Billy in", as for some reason Billy had the knack of pitching in such a way to get batters out. It wasn't an overwhelming speed, but a well thought about pitch between catchers like Greg Carroll or Craig Kamke.

Billy batted at a .225 pace over some 20 plus seasons. Billy remembers hitting two home runs in one of the Coldest games ever played, in Bowler one year.

Today, the Bulldogs were fortunate to talk Billy off the farm field again, to come help manage the 2017 Bulldog squad.
