# LEOPOLIS BASEBALL HALL OF FAME Dave Asenbrenner July 15, 2018

### **Dave Asenbrenner**

Born in 1958, to a long time BABA base umpire Eddie Asenbrenner and mom Adeline, joining brothers Mike and John, and sisters Diane and Marie, Dave started his Bulldog career with the Leopolis Little league and Junior League back in the day, playing for managers Floyd Kristof and Swampy Steinke. He finished up his BABA career pitching for Caroline, as Leopolis was loaded with adequate pitching in that era.

Dave went to Leopolis Grade school and graduated from Marion High in 1976, lettering in Baseball, Basketball and Cross Country.

In High School, Dave remembers throwing a 2 hitter versus Wautoma's pitcher Bill Lear who threw a 1 hitter...Dave had that one hit, a solo home run in the top of the 7<sup>th</sup> for the only run of the game. Coach Bartelt said "it doesn't get any better than that!"

While pursuing a Business Degree at UW-Oshkosh, Dave used his baseball talent to be an All-Conference pitcher at


UWO his sophomore year, participating in the NCAA Division 3 Baseball World Series. He remembers playing games against the likes of Paul Molitor's University of Minnesota team. "Paul had a better baseball career than I did"

With the Bulldog's from 1976 - 1984, Dave spent a lot of time in right field, batting at a .225 average and doing some pitching, before taking that pitching talent to Caroline in 1985, playing in key games versus Leopolis during the playoffs.

Dave remembers the Leopolis team with an unusual number of right handed throwing ball players who batted left and left handed throwers batting right. He heard it was had something to do with the water...

Today Dave lives with his wife Kay (Phillips) near Clintonville for the last 28 years, and works with his brothers at the Asenbrenner Insurance Agency in Shawano, enjoying time with his Step-daughter Kandy and grandson Jadin or you can find him out on a nearby golf course.

### Tom Kristof Jr.

From the time Tom was born in July of 1970, Tom's Hall of Fame dad and mom initiated Tom into spending the next 40 years of Sundays somewhere near a ball diamond. Even to this day he spends it coaching or watching daughter Kenda in softball, or sons Andrew and Kasey playing ball. In the 70's, Tom was chasing foul balls and collecting bats as a bat boy, to the 80's shagging fly balls at practice or before games, and playing Leopolis little league under Louie Hawpetoss. They were Western Shawano county little league champions under coaches Roger Peterson and Darold Paiser. Tom was a western division little league all-star.

In High School, Tom led the Marion Mustangs to the State Tournament in 1988 his senior year under Coach Bartelt. Marion lost the first four games of the year. Tom notes - "We were playing Weyauwega and I was dead at home by about ten feet and I laid the catcher out and was kicked out of the game. Coach Bartelt went

ballistic and pulled me into the corner of the dugout. I remember him saying, what would your dad have thought of that, if you guys don't start playing ball, I'm going to put the underclassman in. Needless to say his speech worked as Marion never lost another game all the way to the State Tournament. I Pitched the Sectional final at Marion to go to state. I remember the girls' softball team was also playing in Marion and won to go to state. They were done before us and the players and fans all came to cheer us on. I struck the last batter out to end the game and everyone mobbed the pitchers' mound leaving me at the bottom of the pile. I thought I was going to die. At state Marion got beat by Greenwood and I had the only hit for Marion, a double high off the left center field wall." Tom led the team in hitting his senior year and was awarded the Tom Kristof Memorial Award for the highest batting average. One of the greatest moments in my career. He Pitched 2 no-hitters in high school. One combined with Jay Brandt.

After High School Tom was invited to a tryout camp for the Cincinnati Reds. Tom says "Well my hopes were dashed as the first thing we had to do was get timed running. Yes, I was slow. Not sure where Kendra gets it as she is the fastest girl in Shawano High school." Tom played against former Milwaukee Brewer and New York Yankee Major Leaguer Bob Wickman and had 2 hits off him in a Legion Game in Shawano for a chance to go to the legion state tournament.

Then came his chance in 1986 to put on the Bulldog uniform and wear it for as many as 26, 27 years until 2012. Over his career Tom played in more games than anyone in the history of Leopolis baseball, Over 1300 at bats and over 400 hits. One year hitting 6 home-runs. He batted .307, averaging 20 hits a year. Looking back at Tom's yearly Stat's, from the Mid 90's to 2010, Tom probably averaged .333 and was Western Division batting champ 2005- .453 average. Played on 1995 Granny team. Tom pitched for many years, played at short and 2<sup>nd</sup> base and then first base which he is most remembered for. According to some, one of the greatest first baseman to play in the BABA. While playing in a Shawano Tournament, Tom remembers leading off, the first pitch of the game with a home-run against former Major Leaguer and Leopolis Hall of Famer Kevin Thiel who was pitching for Navarino at the time.

Finally, Tom notes:

"I had the opportunity to play with both Sons' Andrew and Kasey. I remember my very last at bat for Leopolis was a bottom of the 9th, 2 out, full count walk-off hit to beat Caroline. Andrew was playing for Caroline at the time and I still remember him saying, "It just had to be you who would beat us, didn't it."


I learned everything about baseball at an early age watching and listening to what was said in the dugout as a batboy. I learned the game and how it was supposed to be played by players and former Major League pitcher Leopolis Hall of Famer Bert Thiel of the 70's early 80's Leopolis Team, One of the Greatest Teams to ever play in the BABA. I Hated to lose, a trait passed on from Grandma Kristof. Since the 40's, there has always been a Kristof in the lineup until a few weeks ago.

Over the years I have played with and against many guys and the friendships we shared is something I will never forget. I enjoyed the Camaraderie on and off the field with former team mates like, Todd Hoffman, Kevin and Kelly Thiel, The Carroll boys, Jeff Sousek, Todd Peterson, Billy Lohrentz, Tyler Schmidt, Chris Popp, Joe Prohoska, Whitey Hanson, John Twaroski, Rick Boda, Mike Weatherwax, Matt and Adam Lorge, Jay Brandt, Joe Kristof, my cousins, and many more to include the fans."

Throughout the years Tom has helped out the youth in various sports. coaching Marion Little League, Coached Shawano Youth Baseball, Softball, and girls' basketball. Assistant Shawano Varsity Baseball Coach for 5 years. Assistant Shawano Varsity Football Coach. Currently an Assistant Shawano Girls Varsity Softball Coach.

Tom has been President of the Leopolis Fish and Game Club for over 20 years. And lastly, Tom himself was another successful "Soup Gang Candidate" Drag Queen winner, back when the Ball Club held their 4<sup>th</sup> of July raffle to help pay for all the updates done to the ball field here in Leopolis.

### **Todd Peterson**

Todd Peterson, a man of few words, but had a big impact on the Leopolis baseball field. Born in early December of 1967 to Hall of Fame parents Roger and Carol Peterson, joining a Brother Roger and Sisters Sharon (Helms) and Barbara (Carley).

Summer Baseball started with Leopolis Little League teams under the keen eye of Swampy Steinke and Louie Hawpetoss. Besides being a Running back on the Football team, Todd honed his baseball skill in High School under 4 years of direction of Coach John Bartelt, who kept him mostly as his key 3<sup>rd</sup> baseman, but tried him out on the Mound at times.

Todd's most memorable pitching stint was for the Marion Legion team at Shawano, where Bob Wichman (future mayor league player) hit his fastball so hard, "I think that ball was still flying over the wading pool out past left field there in Shawano". "Bartelt came to the mound and says give me that ball!

Todd's Bulldog career spanned 1984 - 2005, much of it under the direction of Hall of Famer Steve Conradt, was spent playing at third base, hitting for a career batting average of .212, and trying to get his curveball to break, after a night of fun out with the guys.

Todd remembers playing with team-mates such as Hall of Famers Jeff Sousek, Greg, Tom and Jim Carroll, Todd Hoffman, Billy Lohrentz, Kelly Thiel, as well as the likes of future Hall of Famers Mike Weatherwax and Kyle Hoffman.

Today, you can find Todd doing Odd jobs around the area...

"If you need something done – go find Todd"
